## CLASS REWARDS/CONSEQUENCES

I will be using a punch card system in my class. Students will receive 0, 1, or 2 punches. I anticipate most students will receive 1 punch in their card a day. That is a “Good Day!” If students receive 5 bonus points throughout the day, they have had an “Awesome Day!” and will receive 2 punches in their punch card. If a student has struggled, and received a red card (think time), they will not receive a punch in their punch card and may be asked to stay in for a few minutes of recess, or have a note/e-mail sent home. Once students receive 20 punches they will be able to choose a class reward.

## WHAT TO BRING TO SCHOOL:

Please bring a filled water bottle and snack to school. The school water fountains will not be accessible to the students. Please bring a filled water bottle with a pop-top lid. Do not fill water bottles with Gatorade, hot chocolate, etc. Water only, please. They should be cleaned and refilled at home each day. We have a late lunch in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Please send a snack with your student to eat at recess.

## **BEGINNING OF THE DAY**

Students will line up by the third grade doors. Look for your teacher's name written in chalk to show you where you line up. When you arrive at school you will need to go straight to your line, so plan on coming just before the first bell rings at 8:25. Students will not be allowed to play on the playground before school starts. You will need to wear your mask when you are on school grounds. Your teachers will be outside waiting to greet you.

## **FRIDAY WORK/MEETINGS**

Students will bring a folder home on Thursday with a math and/or language arts page to work on. The Friday work and folder is due on Monday.

Students may be invited to come to school or participate in a Zoom meeting on Fridays for additional interventions or enrichment. The scheduled block of time for this is between 10:30 am – 12:55 pm with lunch following, if students come to school, from 12:55 pm – 1:25 pm. Crossing guards will only be available at 10:30 am and 1:25 pm, so students would need to stay for the duration of the time unless arrangements are made with a parent to pick them up. This time is by invitation only. I will arrange this in advance if your student is expected to participate in person or through Zoom on Friday.

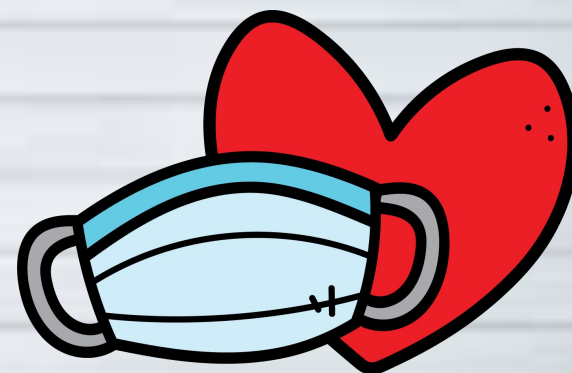
## COVID-19 PROCEDURES

We will be washing or sanitizing hands each time students enter or leave the classroom and if they come into contact with shared supplies. Each night student desks and chairs will be sanitized. Furniture used by all students will be sanitized between each use. Students will have their own supplies and text books. Books that are shared will sit in 72 hour quarantine before they are used again.

There will be one school lunch choice instead of two. Where possible, sack lunches that can be thrown away are preferred to lunch boxes.

The school water fountains will not be accessible to the students. Please have them bring a full water bottle with a pop-top lid. There will be a place for students to refill their bottles if needed. They should be cleaned and refilled at home each day.
