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Third grade is AWESOME! Keyboarding and computer skills will be emphasized from the beginning just in case quarantining or a shut down is required.

We have a lot to learn but in my experience students learn better if they feel they are a part of a safe and accepting community. As a class we will be choosing three power traits to strive for this year and a class mascot to represent our words. Along with these traits we will focus on gratitude, mindfulness and growth mindset.

Class Rules and Behavior Expectations


We are going to be SUPER busy and focused on intense student learning this year. Our classroom expectations help us accomplish our daily learning goals and objectives.

- 1. Follow instructions the first time.
- 2. Keep your hands, feet, mouth and objects to self.
- 3. Do your BEST work.
- 4. Listen respectfully.

I like to focus on the positive things students do each day to remain on task. Students can receive Wahoo! tickets for exceeding expectations which will enter them into class drawings for privileges or small prizes. We will also be working to earn team, class and school rewards and activities. Consequences for not meeting expectations will include a verbal warning, 2 minutes off recess for reteaching and expectation practice purposes and parent contact through email or phone call. If the event is serious the student will go to the office.

Beginning of the day:

Students will line up by the third grade doors. Look for your teacher's name written in chalk to show you where you line up. When you arrive at school you will need to go straight to your line, so plan on coming just before the first bell rings at 8:25. Students will not be allowed to play on the playground before school starts. You will need to wear your mask when you are on school grounds. Your teachers


will come out and get you when the bell rings.

Your child will bring Friday assignments home on Thursday with a math and language arts page and any unfinished assignments to work on. The Friday work is due on Monday, please keep the spelling words at home to practice for the following week.

Students may be invited to come to school or a virtual meetings on Friday for additional interventions or enrichment. This will be scheduled between 10:30 am - 12:55 pm with lunch following from 12:55 pm - 1:25 pm. Crossing guards will only be available at 10:30 am and 1:25 pm, so students would need to stay for the duration of the time unless arrangements are made with a parent to pick them up. This time is by invitation only. I will arrange this in advance if your student is expected on Friday.



Third Grade Specials

All specials will be taught in our classroom.

Monday — PE will be outside or in our classroom. Children need to be prepared with appropriate shoes and outerwear.

<u>Library</u> will be during our reading block so only students who are ready for a new book will go to the library for checkout. Books that are returned will be quarantined for at least 72 hours before being returned to the shelf.

<u>Tuesday</u> - <u>STEAM</u>- A new teacher will be teaching us about artists, science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

Wednesday - Music - Mrs. Michaelis is back for more music fun. or Art-Mrs. Foote is returning for art instruction.

Covid-19 Procedures


