1. Meeting was brought to order at 7:30 AM.
2. Fundraiser: Natalie will get some A frames & a balloon to advertise along the driveway. Tina will be there at 5:30, Bruce at 6:00 and Maggie at 6:30. Funding will go to Safety Patrol.
3. RISE Data for 2024-25 -
 - a. Science: 40%, Foss Kits were organized for teachers to use.
 - b. Math35%, We may see a dip this year as teachers are implementing the new Open Up discussion-based curriculum which is a big shift in how math is taught.
 - c. ELA: 35%, Last year teachers were implementing the new Wit & Wisdom curriculum which was also a shift for instruction. UFLI is being used for intervention.
 - d. Proficiency-based grading is also being implemented this year with the new curriculums. Aides are being utilized to assist students in classrooms with these subjects.
4. ATSI Plan - Funding for an assistant to work with students with disabilities in grades 3-6 to set goals. Acadience, RISE Benchmarks, Power Standards are used. Teachers will also use data binders to help students have more accountability for their learning and increase confidence.
5. Safe Walking Route: Construction in the Villas was discussed. They reported that only in the spring will there be work on the south side for landscaping with no heavy equipment. If anything will be happening on the south side, it will only happen after 9 AM and before 3 PM. They recognize it already as a safe walking route. No changes need to be made for this year. The safe walking route was unanimously approved.
6. School Safety Measures Update: HB84 & HB40 passed with regards to school security. Information was shared from a school safety training from JPAC. Discussion included buckets in classrooms for emergency supplies and requirements from the state. Messages can be sent with feedback about Parent Square at parentsquare@jordandistrict.org. SafeUT app also good for notification. HB104 has firearm safety videos for grades 1, 3, 5; parents can opt out. We believe parents will have access to the videos to decide.
7. Halloween Parade - Feedback for outside parade: teachers liked it being outside as long as it's not cold. It helped with not having to set up chairs and it ensured safety in the building. Made it easy to come and go for families.
